I. CALL TO ORDER – Chair Cavanaugh

Mr. Cavanaugh called the meeting to order at 4:57pm with five members present to establish quorum.

c. City Planning Update

Ms. Statler began the Planning Update with an update about bike share, stating that CMCOG had awarded an RFP to Toole Design Group for the upcoming bike share expansion study.

Mr. Shaughnessy reminded BPAC that PARK(ing) Day was scheduled for the coming Friday, that Bicyclist and Pedestrian Counts had begun, and that October was Planning Month.

III. OTHER BUSINESS

Ms. Bynoe-Reed asked if members of BPAC could be college students. Ms. Statler replied that students could be BPAC members but they would have to be appointed by Council, though they were welcome to come to the meetings as members of the public.

Ms. Bynoe-Reed also provided an update about the Soda Cap revamp which is likely to roll out in mid-October.

IV. PUBLIC COMMENT

Ms. Young-Pierre said that Blue Bike's anniversary is in October and suggested a BPAC-led group bike ride on October 8. She also provided an update that Blue Bike had acquired new motors to convert some bikes to electric bikes. Additionally, she said that now that the school year has started, Blue Bike stations near the colleges and universities had seen a jump in popularity and that she had included information in U of SC's orientation packets.
